- You may use a TLC desktop computer or you can bring along your Kindle, Nook, laptop, iPad or phone if you prefer to use these devices.
- The NEW 125Live Library online catalog will be available for viewing both on the Library computer, the TLC computers, and also on any device anywhere that has Internet access.
- Did you know that we have an Optelec ClearView+ Low Vision Table Top Magnifier for members' use? Volunteers will be available to demonstrate.

WHAT DOES THE 125LIVE LIBRARY OFFER MEMBERS?

The 125 LIVE Library area is located downstairs in the “Gathering Place”. There are ~1500 books on the shelves, arranged in Fiction, Large Print, Biography, Paperback and non-Fiction sections. All members are welcome to visit the Library area as a reading room, and a jigsaw is available for social members to work on collaboratively.

The Library Catalog is free to be viewed online at <https://125library.libib.com/> within the 125Live building and anywhere on any internet-connected smart device (computer, laptop, iPad, Chromebook, iPhone, Android Phone etc.). The online catalog can be searched and ordered by title, author or date published to help members peruse the shelves digitally both in-house or at home. Most entries include a synopsis or book review and a book cover picture.

An icon linked to the online catalog has been placed on the desktops of all the computers in the 125 LIVE Technology Learning Center for ease of access by Social Members. Volunteers are available, upon request, to help Social Members explore the online catalog, and if required set up a Member account.

Books can be checked out to Social Members using a pen and paper process (as is currently used) but with a Member account, Social Members are able to place holds, check out online and keep a record of the books they have read.

An Optelec ClearView+ Low Vision Table Top Magnifier is available in the Library for Social Members. Brief instructions and a full manual are available by the magnifier, and volunteers are available, upon request, to demonstrate its operation.
